- 4. Guest Speaker: Bob Chisolm long time beekeeper Spring Management:

Bob spoke to us about early Spring items to keep in mind as Spring approaches

- -must have strong hive health before hives go out for pollinating contracts
- -don't start too early!
- -dangerous to open too early and chill brood
- -lose more hives in March than over the winter
- -check out website: Paul van Westendorp at Ministry of Agriculture
- -when temp is 10 C, on average, not too quickly, let them bee... 3 trips in Spring:
 - 1. 10 C sunny no wind
 - -lift lid and say hi if they are, then lid down, if bees not there, look deeper
 - 2. look for brood temp must be warmer, will start laying soon
 - 3. later on (mid- March?) warm enough to look at brood (7 C at night,
 - 15 C daytime), look for eggs, larvae, evidence of disease, etc

-then you can start working on hive, clean bottom board, check frames

- -if hive is needed for pollination: feed now, pollen patties, etc
- -talked about mite treatment
- -Queens: buy package, keep girls strong, re-queen every 2 years
- -Mid-May: introduce new foundation, mite check alcohol wash leave until warm enough, treatment
